

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

between

Korea University, School of Law

and

University of California, Davis, School of Law

The following describe the elements of an initial partnership between the University of California, Davis School of Law and Korea University School of Law.

PARTIES

The parties to this agreement are Korea University, School of Law and the University of California, Davis School of Law.

PARTNERSHIP GOALS

In accordance with a mutual desire to promote international academic, cultural and scientific exchange, Korea University, School of Law and University of California, Davis School of Law enter into this partnership agreement.

Due to their shared short and long-term goals, both institutions, for the purpose of furthering their cooperation through educational and academic exchanges, hereby affirm their intent to promote a series of joint activities, programs and exchanges that will be of mutual benefit for their institutions and will foster a long-term relationship between the law schools. Because these activities vary, separate working agreements will be created between the parties as appropriate.

OBJECT OF THE AGREEMENT

The object of the Agreement is to affirm the partnership between Korea University, School of Law and the University of California, Davis School of Law and to outline potential initial activities. This is not meant to be an exclusive list, but rather a series of initial steps to further the partnership goals. New initiatives and activities may be added through the mutual agreement of the parties.

POTENTIAL ACTIVITIES

SCHOLARLY EXCHANGE AND JOINT ACITIVITIES

- To strengthen the relationship between faculty members at both institutions and to foster scholarly exchange and cooperation, the following outlines some initial activities that the faculty of both institutions may undertake together.
 - o Faculty scholarly collaborations through joint conferences
 - o A KU/UC Davis Faculty Exchange Workshop. The first one will be held at UC Davis and the next at KU (or visa versa) based on a mutually agreed upon scholarly theme. The host institution will pay for hotel and food for the visiting conference and the visiting institution will pay for transportation and other costs associated with the Faculty Exchange Workshop).
 - o KU and UCD welcomes visiting scholars to teach in their respective summer programs for appropriate fees.
 - o Both law schools welcome visiting faculty to their law schools for short or longer visits in the summer, winter or spring without visiting scholarship fees. Each visiting scholar will have a host faculty member
 - o The UC Davis School of Law welcomes Korea University Ph.D. students to its law school to undertake research related to their degrees

STUDENT EXCHANGE AND THE LL.M. PROGRAM

- To provide an opportunity for students from both institutions to experience the value of studying in another legal system and culture, the two institutions will initiate a student exchange program.
 - o UC Davis welcomes up to two Korea University exchange students to UC Davis each year (or one or two students for a semester) on a home tuition basis
 - o Korea University welcomes up to two UC Davis exchange students to Korea University on a home tuition basis

 - o UC Davis School of Law welcomes Korea University students and its alumni into its LL.M. program. Korea University students and alumni participating in the UC Davis LL.M. program will receive a discount fellowship.

COLLABORATIVE DEGREES

- In keeping with the longer terms goals of the partnership and to provide expanded opportunities for faculty and students at both law schools, Korea University School of


Law and the University of California, Davis School of Law will explore the following formal degree relationships

- a dual KU JD/UC Davis LL.M.
- incorporating the UC Davis LL.M. into its master's and Ph.D. degrees
- a dual JD degree of KU and UC Davis

FOLLOW-UP WORKING AGREEMENTS


